College Application

While in the United States, the student is required to obey all the government laws covering immigration status requirements, state and local laws, as well as the rules set by the host family and *SPONSOR'S STANDARDS OF CONDUCT*.

- I. **DANGEROUS ACTIVITIES**
Skydiving, hang gliding, glider riding, parachute jumping, parasailing, jet skiing, and riding in hot air balloons are prohibited.
- II. **DRINKING**
The legal drinking age in the United States is 21 years old. Students must obey the drinking laws of the state and customs of the family and the community. Failure to obey this regulation will result in dismissal from the program and the student being returned to his/her home country.
- III. **DRIVING**
The student is required to take full responsibility of owning a motor vehicle, should he/she choose to purchase one. This includes obtaining a proper drivers license, assuming all responsibilities of vehicle payments, and obtaining full automotive insurance coverage. PROGRAM SPONSOR will not be liable for any damages or expenses incurred as a result of your driving privileges.
- IV. **DRUGS**
The student is required to refrain from using drugs of any kind (other than prescribed drugs for health purposes). Further, no association is to be maintained with anyone involved with drugs or drug use in any way. Any student who breaks this rule will be returned to his/her home country immediately.
- V. **FINAL AUTHORITY**
 - A. Students must respect all decisions made by PROGRAM SPONSOR and its coordinators or staff.
 - B. PROGRAM SPONSOR reserves the right to dismiss a student from the program, if there should arise, in the judgment of PROGRAM SPONSOR officials, a condition likely to be detrimental to the health of the student.
 - C. PROGRAM SPONSOR reserves the right to dismiss a student from the program should the student violate the Standards of Conduct or for other disciplinary problems
- VI. **HITCHHIKING**
Hitchhiking is extremely dangerous. Students are not permitted to hitchhike, either alone or with friends.
- VII. **HOST FAMILY REGULATIONS**
Each family has rules and regulations that help it function effectively. It is imperative that each student makes every effort possible to understand what his/her family expects. Each student must be respectful of his/her host family and the rules that govern the household. It is the student's responsibility to make the Host Family aware of extended periods of time away from home. Overnight guests are prohibited in the Host Family home.
- VIII. **LAW VIOLATIONS**
If a student admits to a criminal law violation, or is arrested and charged, or if reliable information is received that the student will be arrested and charged, the student will be returned to his/her home country as soon as legally possible. Students are expected to obey all laws of the host country, state, city and community.
- IX. **LEAVING THE PROGRAM**
A student may not leave the program at any time without the express written consent of PROGRAM SPONSOR. When a student leaves the program, except for emergencies, he/she may not return to the program. Refunds will not be made except in cases of emergency. The student may leave the program due to death or serious illness in the immediate family or for other bona fide emergency situations as determined by PROGRAM SPONSOR.
- X. **MONEY**
Because each student is responsible to purchase his/her own personal items, each student is responsible for his/her own spending money. PROGRAM SPONSOR is not responsible for any lost or stolen money. It is against PROGRAM SPONSOR regulations for a student to place his/her money in the Host Family's bank account. Further, no student shall lend money to, or borrow money from, any member of his/her Host Family.
